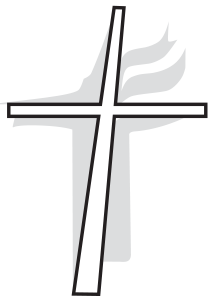

+ POSTLUDE *Prelude in B minor, BWV 544* J. S. Bach

The Prelude and Fugue in B minor, BWV 544, was likely written in the late 1720s, when Bach was serving as music director ("kantor") for the three main churches in Leipzig. The prelude is a melancholy and stern piece, full of anguished dissonance and chromaticism. Some historians guess that it was written and performed for the funeral of Christiane Eberhardine, Electress of Saxony and Queen of Poland.
